At our MN Conference UMW Day Apart, speaker **Erin Marcks** gave instructions for drawing a <u>finger laby-rinth</u>. Once the labyrinth is drawn, a finger can wind its way through the passage as the mind meditates on words of positivity and hope. Your labyrinth is your unique creation!! All you need is a blank piece of paper and a writing tool.

To draw a finger labyrinth:

- Draw a small plus sign on your paper, about a third of the way down the page. (You'll need space above it.)
- Draw a dot in each 'corner' as if you were going to draw a square around the plus sign.
- Draw an upside down 'u' shape, connecting the top of the plus with the dot to the right of it.
- Connect the top dot on the left with the end of the right side of the plus sign, moving clockwise.
- Keep drawing lines from the next open spot to the left to the next open spot to the right.

Now there is a labyrinth with one way in, and one way out. Write words of affirmation—love, courage, strength, justice, joy, love, unity, harmony, etc.—in a circle around your labyrinth. Meditate on the words as you move your finger through the passage.

Unit Highlights from UMWs in our district

CHATFIELD

The Chatfield UMW supports **Maple Leaf Services, Inc.** throughout each year. Maple Leaf Services (contact@mapleleafservices.org) has provided support to people with disabilities since 1977. They are located throughout Fillmore County with licensed residential sites in Preston, Harmony, Rushford and Spring Valley. During the 1990's, they began providing In-Home Services. In 2006, Maple Leaf Services began a supported Employment Service. Chatfield UMW supports the facility in Preston. We collect used greeting cards (of all types) along with our congregation. A basket is placed in the narthex for people to drop them in. Monthly, a UMW member takes them to the facility. The cards are made into new ones and sold in their thrift store. The store has some regular customers who frequently purchase 100 cards at a time! Each June we have a shower for the residents by collecting needed health and beauty products throughout the month. With the help of our congregation, we purchase Christmas gifts in December as well. Popular items are CD's, western movies, stuffed animals and pajamas (we are given a wish list for each.)

HOLY TRINITY (PRIOR LAKE)

The Holy Trinity United Methodist Women enjoyed a restaurant lunch outing followed by a visit to the **Hoċokata Ti**, the Shakopee Mdewakanton Sioux Community's (SMSC) cultural center and gathering place in Shakopee. It is used to interpret and encourage traditional Mdewakanton Dakota cultural heritage, language, and history by sustaining this inherent knowledge of SMSC Members through exhibitions, preservation, and education. We were given a guided tour of *Mdewakanton: Dwellers of the Spirit Lake*.



This public exhibit provided us with a cultural experience that enhanced our knowledge and understanding of the Mdewakanton Dakota people and their history. We viewed an assortment of Dakota artifacts in the public gallery and also visited the gift shop. This was an extremely worthwhile learning experience for us, and we encourage other Sisters-in-Christ to visit this cultural center located southwest of Minneapolis/St. Paul in Shakopee. EMMA NORTON 2021 OPENING DOORS HERITAGE AWARD WINNER! GINNY VANDERVEST

At the 2021 Opening Doors Gala in April, **Ginny Vandervest** was named winner of the **2021 Heritage Award** for her service to Emma Norton Services, a National Mission of United Methodist Women. The Heritage Award is given to an individual who has a long-standing relationship with Emma Norton and has made a major impact on the mission. There are few as deserving of this award as Ginny, who first became involved with Emma Norton in the 1980s alongside Hastings United Methodist Women, and has been a dedicated supporter since. She served on the Board of Directors for 6 years, and helped oversee the creation of Emma Norton's townhome community for families in 2002. Ginny's work to spread awareness, as well as her service and stewardship on the Development, Opening Doors, and Planned Giving Committees, is a great gift to Emma Norton that empowers our whole community.

Tonya Brownlow, Executive Director at Emma Norton, introduced Ginny at the Gala saying "Virginia Vandervest has been a long-time volunteer, leader, and supporter for Emma Norton. She has been married for nearly 54 years and has two sons and two grandsons. She has a long heritage of giving back to her community and is a retired RN. She loves to read, crochet, and volunteer—and we love when she volunteers with Emma Norton on our Opening Doors and Planned Giving Committees. Please join me in welcoming and honoring Ginny Vandervest—our 2021 Opening Doors Heritage Award Winner".

And here are Ginny's words as she accepted the award: "I became aware of Emma Norton Residence in the mid 1980's when a very special friend, Maureen Gere, encouraged me to become involved in Hastings United Methodist Women. I became involved on the District Level and served as President of Metro East District. As I learned more about Emma Norton, a National Mission of United Methodist Women and its purpose, my interest grew. Another mentor from Hastings UMC, Gus Heinold, had served on the board at the time the present building was envisioned and built. While serving on the MN Conference UMW, I learned more and became involved in the expansion to the townhomes and motivated to serve on the board for six years. During that time, I was on the Development Committee and served as Chair for 2 years. I remain on that committee, along with the Opening Doors Committee and the Planned Giving Committee—helping raise critical funds and awareness for the organization.

I feel very humbled and honored to join those who have received this award before me. For years Elizabeth Everitt and Mary Gates have inspired me and more recently, Sandy Craighead - very dedicated Sisters-in-Christ. I remain dedicated to the mission and purpose of Emma Norton Services to help women, children and families in need and wish to thank those who nominated me for this award".

EMMA NORTON SERVICES NEWS





August is here and it is time to share an update on activities involving Emma Norton Services.

Emma's Place townhomes have been renovated and families continue to move into the vacant units. The playground at the 13-unit complex was fully assembled in May with the help from volunteers. This was the final piece of the project which was rescheduled several times due to our changing Minnesota weather. The kids are busy playing on the new playground already! (photos on pg 7)

Barb Payne The Opening Doors 2nd Virtual Gala was a success. The stretch goal of \$90,000 was not quite met, but the amount raised was approximately \$7000 more than the past year. Pledges, new donors, sponsors and auction revenue were all increased. The River Valley district was a significant contributor to auction items, donations and purchases. Thank you all for your generosity. The hope is to have an in-person gathering next year with possibly a hybrid-virtual component. The Opening Doors Gala can still be viewed online. With the annual operations fundraiser complete, energy is being focused on the new building project that will be located in the new Highland Bridge Neighborhood. \$18 million of the approximate \$21 million needed was approved by the Minnesota Housing Board. A number of other gifts have also been received. An official capital campaign will be starting soon as well as a groundbreaking ceremony later this October. The old Emma Norton Residence will be sold by National UMW and a yet to-be-determined portion of the sale will be donated to the new building.

ENS staff, residents, board and other stakeholders have been busy identifying a name for the new building. It will be announced by email and social media later in July or early August. Follow Emma Norton on Facebook or signup for their e-newsletter at www.emmanorton.org. Emma Norton can't wait to share the new name with their residents and supporters!

Don't forget to register for the Annual Gathering of our River Valley District that will be held on September 25th at Stewartville United Methodist Church (reg form on pg 12). Our guest speaker will be from ENS, and she will be providing information about ENS and the building design and capital campaign. This is an exciting time and an opportunity for our mission to be able to help more women and children.

I will be at the Annual Gathering and hope to transport your generous gifts of paper products and any welcome baskets or totes you have assembled. (see below)

MOVE-IN TOTES INCLUDE ONE LARGE TOTE BAG FILLED WITH: 1 roll paper towel, 1 box facial tissues, 4 rolls toilet paper, 1 container disinfecting wipes, 1 bottle multi-purpose cleaner, 1 bottle toilet bowl cleaner, 1 toilet bowl scrubber, 1 box of large garbage bags, 1 bottle laundry detergent, 1 bottle hand soap, 1 bottle dish soap, 2 sponges, 2 dish towels, 4 plastic plates, 4 plastic tumblers, 4 sets cutlery, 1 kitchen towel, 1 shower curtain, 1 package shower curtain rings, 2 hand towels, 2 washcloths, 3 bars body soap, 1 deodorant, 1 tube toothpaste, 4 toothbrushes, 1 floss, 1 bottle shampoo, 1 bottle conditioner, 1 box assorted bandages, 1 box rolled gauze, 1 roll medical tape, 1 box gauze pads, 1 box alcohol prep pads, 1 tube antibiotic ointment, 1 tube hydrocortisone cream, 2 lightbulbs, 1 blanket (twin or queen), 2 bath towels, 1 bed sheet set (twin or queen).

Other ways you can help ENS include:



INFORMATION FOR RVD ANNUAL GATHERING ON SEPTEMBER 25

To River Valley District UMW members: The Standing Rules Committee has discussed and proposed changes to our district's Standing Rules that must be discussed and voted on at our Annual Gathering on September 25. The suggested additions or changes are **bolded** and/or <u>underlined</u> in the document below. The **bolded** changes will put our Standing Rules in compliance with Minnesota Conference UMW Standing Rules; those that are <u>underlined</u> apply only to River Valley District United Methodist Women.

UNITED METHODIST WOMEN Minnesota Annual Conference River Valley District Standing Rules To be approved, Fall 2021

The following rules shall govern the actions of the River Valley District as long as they are in harmony with the Constitution and Bylaws of the **UMW National** and are in harmony with the Standing Rules of the Minnesota Conference **UMW National**. The River Valley District Minnesota Conference United Methodist Women shall be herein referred to as River Valley District UMW.

ARTICLE 1 ELECTIONS

Sec. 1 Election shall be by acclamation unless more than one name for an office is presented, in which case a written ballot shall be required.

Sec. 2 Officers shall be elected for a 2-year period alternating as follows:

Even-numbered years	Odd-numbered years

Treasurer	Secretary
Mission Coordinators:	Mission Coordinators:
Spiritual Growth	Social Action
Education & Interpretation	Membership Nurture & Outreach
Secretary of Program Resources	Chair, Committee on Nominations
Communications Coordinator	

Recognizing that not all positions may be filled, additional positions can be filled at any time as needed upon approval of the Executive Committee.

Sec. 3 The representative to the Emma Norton Services shall be appointed for a 2-year term to coincide with the policies of the Emma Norton Board. They are eligible for re-appointment for one 2-year term. This service shall not be counted toward tenure as elected officers.

Sec. 4 For an officer to fill an un-expired term of office, if the time to be served is one year or longer, the period to be served shall be considered the first term, thus giving the privilege of re-election for one additional term in the same office. If the time to be served is less than one year, it shall not constitute a first term.

Sec. 5 All officers shall be eligible for re-election for one 2-year term in the same office.

Tenure on the Executive Committee for elected leadership shall be limited to a total of eight years unless a woman is elected to serve as President.

Treasurers may be elected for an additional term of 2 years for a total of 6 years.

Someone who has served tenure (a total of 8 years), after 4 years may be elected to serve for one term

(2 years) in a different office in which she has not served.

Sec. 6 Resource people are appointed by the River Valley District UMW President with the assistance of the Nominating Committee for 1-year terms as needed with a limit of 4 years. This service shall not be counted toward tenure as elected officers.

ARTICLE 2 MEETINGS

Sec. 1 The River Valley District UMW Annual **Gathering** date will be set by River Valley District Executive Committee. The voting body of the River Valley District UMW Annual **Gathering** shall consist of all attending who are members of a local Unit of the River Valley District.

Sec. 2 The River Valley District UMW Executive Committee shall meet at least 4 times per year. **One shall be in conjunction with the District Annual Gathering.**

Sec. 3 All elected River Valley District UMW officers are required to attend the Mission u or Mission u Too unless excused by the Minnesota Conference UMW President.

Sec. 4 All elected officers are required to attend **annual leadership training** unless excused by the Minnesota Conference UMW President.

Article 3 FUNDS

Sec. 1 The River Valley District UMW shall make an annual mission pledge to UMW National through the Minnesota Conference UMW.

Sec. 2 All River Valley District UMW monies must be handled by duly elected treasurers only, since treasurers **and presidents** are bonded. The financial records must be audited each year by a certified public accountant or a person with a 4-year accounting degree.

Sec. 3 Funds for River Valley District UMW Administration and Membership Development (A&MD) shall be received by the River Valley District UMW Treasurer from the Minnesota Conference UMW Treasurer at the beginning of each quarter. The amount shall have been approved by the Minnesota Conference UMW Finance Committee.

Sec. 4 From this River Valley District UMW Administration and Membership Development Fund the District shall make the following provisions:

- A. Upon election the District President will be given a president's pin.
- B. For all elected River Valley District UMW officers upon completion of a first term of office, a basic Special Mission Recognition pin shall be given.
- C. Upon completion of a second term, a \$25 Gift to Mission shall be given in her honor. If the treasurer is elected to a third 2-year term, a Gift to Mission shall be given in her honor when that third term is complete.
- D. For an elected District Officer who only served a partial term, a \$20 Gift to Mission shall be given.
- E. Upon the death of a District Officer while in office, a \$25 Gift in Memory shall be given to the UMW National.
- F. Upon completion of the 2-year term as the Chairperson of the Committee on Nominations, a basic Special Mission Recognition pin shall be given.
- G. Upon completion of a 4-year term on the Committee on Nominations, a basic Special Mission Recognition pin shall be given.
- H. Appointed officers shall serve at least 2 years before receiving a Special Mission Recognition basic pin; or if less—the amount for Gift to Mission for 1 year=\$15, or less than 2 years=\$20, and after 4 years a \$25 Gift to Mission.
- 1. Upon completion of two 2-year terms as President, a \$25 Gift to Mission will be given.

Sec. 5 No organization or individual may solicit funds from the River Valley District UMW which has not been authorized by the Minnesota Conference UMW Executive Committee. All monies will go through the proper channels.

Sec. 6 The River Valley District UMW Executive Committee for the current year will decide the proper amount to be spent on programs and speakers during the year.

ARTICLE 4 EXPENSE OF OFFICERS

Sec. 1 Each member of the River Valley District UMW Executive Committee shall present her expense account using the official River Valley District UMW voucher. Approved expenses include mileage, meals, housing, postage, office supplies, promotional materials, program materials, necessary telephone calls and other pertinent expenses. To be reimbursed for a meeting expense, she must attend the meeting in its entirety or be excused by the **District UMW President**. For reimbursement all expenses incurred before December 1st must be presented to the District Treasurer by Dec.10th of each year, or reimbursement will be forfeited.

Sec. 2 When a River Valley District UMW officer is called in by the Minnesota Conference UMW, her expenses will be paid by the Minnesota Conference UMW providing she attends the meeting in its entirety or is excused by the Minnesota Conference UMW President.

Sec. 3 The River Valley District UMW shall pay transportation and meals for members of the River Valley District UMW Executive Committee to River Valley District UMW meetings. The mileage reimbursement shall be at the mileage rate set by the Minnesota Conference UMW. An allowance of \$30 will be given toward motel lodging if a required meeting is 50 or more miles one way. The district will not pay for officers who do not register by the dead-line. They will need to pay their own registration fee.

Sec. 4 Allowed expenses may be vouchered for all elected and appointed River Valley District UMW officers to attend the Minnesota Conference UMW Annual Gathering.

Sec. 5 Allowed expenses may be vouchered for all elected and appointed River Valley District UMW officers to attend one session of the Mission u or Mission u Too.

ARTICLE 5 COMMITTEES

Sec. 1 The River Valley District UMW Executive Committee shall be composed of all the elected and appointed officers of the District and any person residing within the district who is on the Board of the UMW National, Minnesota Conference United Methodist Women, Jurisdiction United Methodist Women, the World Federation of Methodist Women, the River Valley District Superintendent, and a representative of Emma Norton Services. The immediate past president shall remain as an advisory member, with vote, for a period of one year following completion of her term of office.

Sec. 2 The Committee on Nominations shall consist of 5 to 11 members including the chairperson. The Chairperson of the Nominating Committee shall be elected by the River Valley District UMW and at the time of the election have 2 or 3 years remaining on the Nominating Committee.

Sec. 3 The River Valley District UMW Standing Rules Committee, consisting of the River Valley District UMW President, Secretary, Treasurer, and one other member of the River Valley District UMW Executive Committee, shall meet as necessary. They shall present revisions to be voted on by the River Valley District UMW Executive Committee and the River Valley District UMW membership.

ARTICLE 6 CORRESPONDENCE

Sec. 1 Correspondence from the River Valley District UMW Officers shall be mailed/emailed and/or distributed to the corresponding local officers of each Unit within the River Valley District. In addition, the same shall be mailed/emailed and or distributed to all members of the River Valley District UMW Executive Committee, the corresponding Minnesota Conference UMW Officers, and the Minnesota Conference UMW President.

Sec. 2 The United Methodist Women do not furnish lists of their elected leaders or members to individuals or agencies outside the organization unless authorized by the Conference Executive Committee.
