Rev. Dr. Curtiss Paul DeYoung is the CEO of the Minnesota Council of Churches. Previously he was the Executive Director of the historic racial justice organization, Community Renewal Society, in Chicago. He also was the Inaugural Professor of Reconciliation Studies at Bethel University in St. Paul. Rev. DeYoung earned degrees from the University of St. Thomas in St. Paul, Howard University School of Divinity, and Anderson University. He is an ordained minister in the Church of God and is a member of Park Avenue United Methodist Church. He is an author and editor of 12 books on reconciliation, interfaith social justice activisim, racism, and cultural diversity. His most recent book, Becoming Like Creoles: Living and Leading at the Intersections of Injustice, Culture, and Religion (Fortress) was co-authored with six women. He was also on the editorial team for The Peoples' Bible (Fortress). He has extensive relationships among activists and peacemakers in South Africa and the Holy Land.

Reading Program – KEEP READING!

I'll be the first to admit that I really don't like not having UMW Reading Program books available to review and purchase at our District Meetings. When consignment sales were part of our meetings, we were able to see the books up close and personal. Maybe a title to a book did not thrill us but after looking at the book and reading the back cover, we would discover that this **really was a book we wanted to read and a subject that really did interest us.** It was more work for the Program Resource Manager, but it seemed like a good system to me. But "times they are a'changin"!

In an effort to give you a better look at the books for the 2020 Reading Program, paper copies of the online catalog of the new books will be available at the February 1st TC District Meeting. This information gives detailed instructions for being involved in the reading program along with short synopses of this year's books. This same information is available in the Nov/Dec 2019 issue of **response magazine**, pages 28-34 and at https://www.unitedmethodistwomen.org. Also available will be copies of local library availability for the reading program books from the last several years through the 2020 books.

Getting your books through other sources is not a bad thing either. The cost of the books through Amazon.com are oftentimes less expensive than what was charged through the service center. Also, when using the Amazon Smile Program you can benefit United Methodist Women – either the global office in New York, or you can set up an account to benefit your own local unit. Purchases made for any reason – not just books - using Amazon Smile can help send money to the organization that you designate. With minimal purchases made, postage If units are ordering books for their is **free**. libraries, the minimum will be very easy to reach. If you are building your own library and want to purchase books for yourself, usually 2 books will put you at the minimum. If you don't reach the minimum, consider sharing an order with a friend to reach the minimum.

Whatever method you use for finding the books involved with the reading program, please **KEEP READING!** The books are chosen to educate and

inspire us in the various areas of mission and social justice issues. Reading leads us to become active in causes benefitting women and children around the world.

Currently there is no one who will be taking on the job of Program Resources Manager beginning in 2020. See our President, Sandra Adelmund, if you are interested in talking about this job.

To put a cap on the 2019 reading program, there is still time to report your reading activity. Please send your list of books to me no later than January 8th for inclusion in recognition at the February meeting at Good Samaritan. Christmas blessings to all.

The following financial report of the Twin Cities District is for the third quarter plus October.

Balance for Administration and Membership Development funds as of October 30, 2019 is \$5911.33.

Our total Mission Giving is \$26,474.50.

Our total Mission Giving Plus is \$5966.55.

Our 2019 Mission Giving Pledge is \$68,000. So far we have given \$26,474.50 which is 38.9% of our pledge.

Our Emma Norton Pledge is \$10.000. so far we have given \$4410.00 which is 44.1% of our pledge.

Census 2019 Q & A

Q.: Where do I find the census form?

A. Go on line.

Q: My unit has no president. Who should fill out the form?

A: Anyone in your unit can fill out and submit the form. Just one submission per unit.

Q: How can I fill out the form if I don't have a computer?

A: Ask someone in your church office to help you or a friend or even a family member. Or call the conference membership coordinator: Melinda Kohrt at 952-934-9325.

Q: When should the form be submitted?

A: The deadline is **March 30, 2020.** Do it soon before you forget.

Q: Does our unit need to do this every year?

A: Yes

Q: My UMW unit is so small, do we still need to send in a census report?

A: Yes. There are many small churches around Minnesota, and <u>everyone</u> counts. All of us together make things happen!

The article was submitted to Susanne Mattison, a long time supporter of Emma Norton. Susanne continues to sell vintage pins, as well as Open Door pins, at our gatherings, with proceeds going to Emma Norton Services.

Emma Norton has had a magnificent year of growth this year. In 2019, we brought our annual Opening Doors Dinner to the heart of St. Paul, established new partnerships with the St. Paul Saints, the Winter Carnival, and Hamline Dining Hall. We also held very successful winter coat and holiday gift/gift card drives. Looking ahead to 2020, we are excited about launching an extensive renovation of Emma's Place, including the 13 townhomes, the green space/playground, and the community space in Maplewood in early spring. Additionally, we are moving forward with plans for a new building in St. Paul (to replace the aging Emma Norton Residence) to provide more trauma-informed care and increase the number of individuals we serve. We are still 3 to 5 years away from a new building, but excited to kick off a campaign in 2020 to bring our dreams to reality.

We're incredibly grateful for the support of our donors and partners, especially from our UMC and UMW partners, as we've grown to serve over 300 individuals and families (nearly double from three years ago!). With the support of numerous UMC/UMW groups, as well as a generous grant from the Balch Memorial Fund, we will be able to give each resident a small gift and a \$25 gift card at our three holiday parties (for Emma Norton

Residence, Emma's Place, and our new Scattered-Site Housing Program) this December!

In addition to our holiday needs, our program staff has identified a need for the following items this winter: twin/queen sized mattress pads, comforters, and warm blankets; diapers (newborn-size 5), wipes, and pull-ups; and journal sets and art Donations may be dropped off at any supplies. time to Emma Norton Residence, 670 Robert Street North in St. Paul. Thank you for your generous support of Emma Norton and our mission to provide transformational housing to women and families on their journey to recovery. Please save the date for the annual Emma Norton Opening Doors Dinner to be held Thursday, April 23, 2020 at the Inter Continental St. Paul Riverfront. Registration opens in February 2020. We hope to see you there!

Recap of the Minnesota Conference United Methodist Women 46th Annual Gathering at Centennial United Methodist Church in Roseville, MN

- After 8 years, Bishop Ough will be leaving the Minnesota/North and South Dakota Conference. The attendees were honored to hear him speak about "Where are we as United Methodists?" as our cultural environment has changed, resulting in at least 5 plans for the restructuring of the world wide Methodist church. One take away is to engage in conversations at one's church. There is a need to know one's core values and to know who we are as United Methodists.
- Bridget Sabo, from the Legal Rights Center, talked about her work in YEARS (Youth, Education, Advocacy, Restoration, Series).
 She referenced the School-to-Prison Pipeline and how the practice of restoration is so important in providing justice to all youth.

The center has a need for mentors and those who can help with reading skills.

New Standing Rules for the Minnesota Conference UMW were adopted. Perhaps the most noteworthy change is that in evennumbered years, only the Treasurer and the Chairperson of the Nominating Committee will be elected; in the odd-numbered years, only the President and Secretary will be elected All other coordinators and leadership positions will be filled by appointment the Committee by on Nominations. *In the Twin Cities, a committee has been appointed to revise the district's standing rules and by-laws and to align them with the Conference's revisions of the last 2 years.

Minnetonka UMW Receives Grant

A grant for projects helping to break the School-to-Prison Pipeline was awarded to Minnetonka UMW from National United Methodist Women, for work on this issue in 2020. The UMW group will be partnering with the Restorative Justice Community Action Youth Diversion Program (RJCA) in the Twin Cities to provide training for participating in the Youth Diversion program, and with the Commission on Race and Religion team (CORR) at Minnetonka UMC to hold two implicit bias circles. The Youth Diversion program for first time offenders, helps the youth take responsibility for their actions and make amends so that they do not have to go to prison and break the cycle. Other United Methodist Women groups in the Twin Cities area are invited to join in this effort.
